













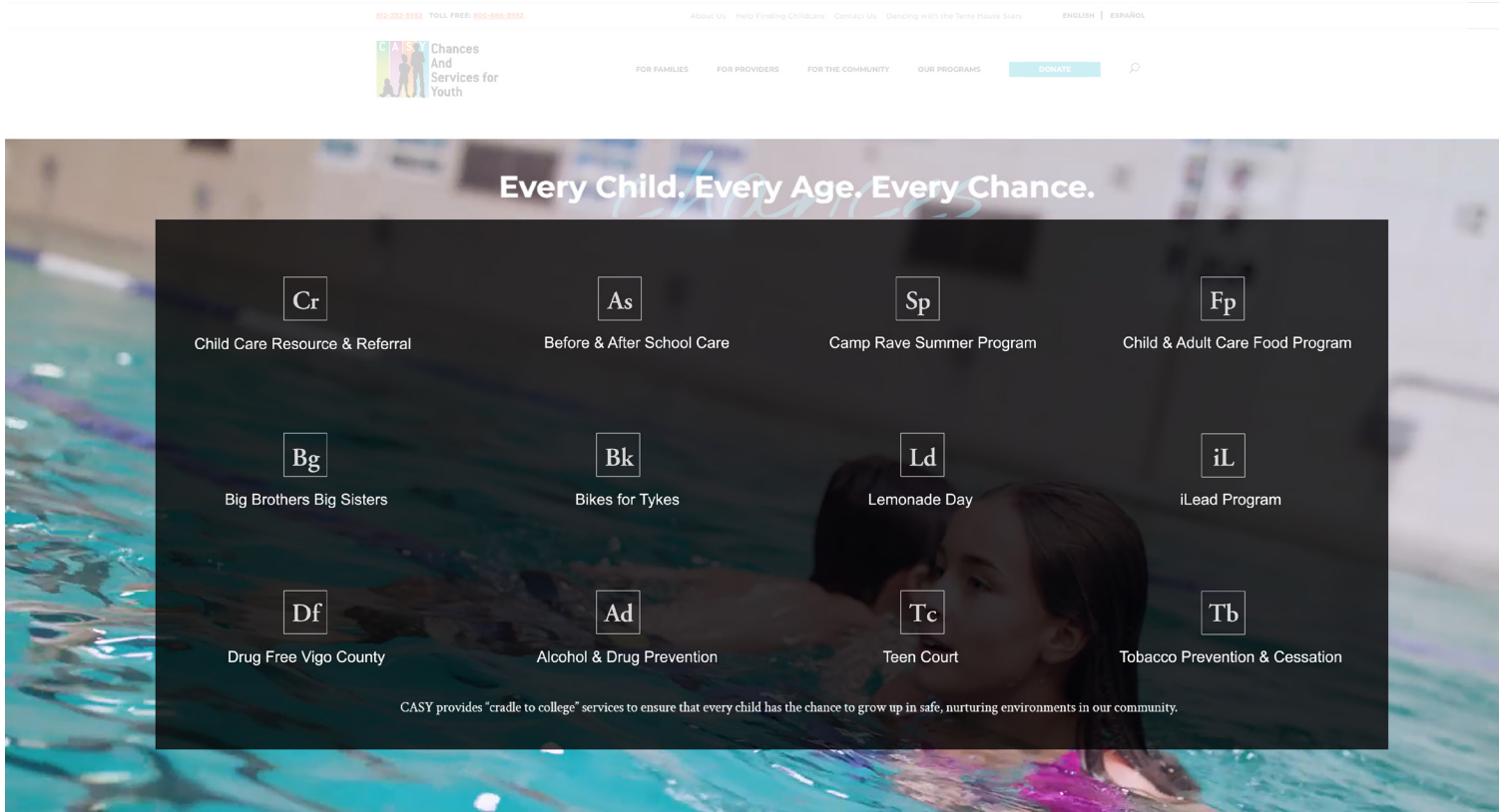
VISUAL LANGUAGE

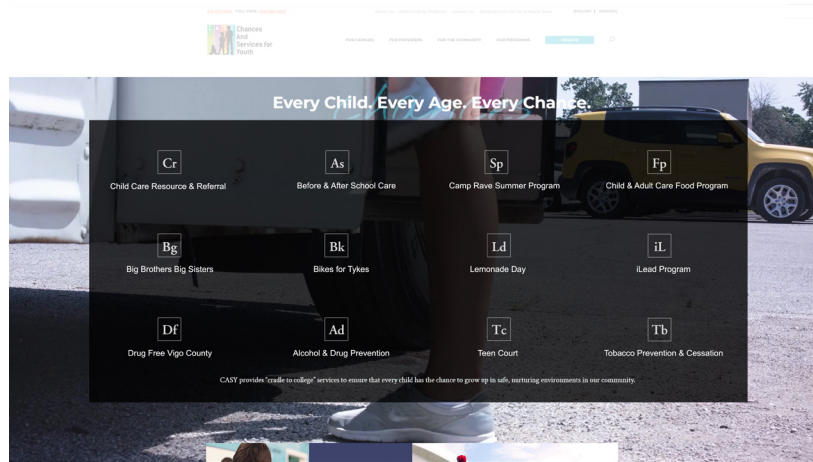
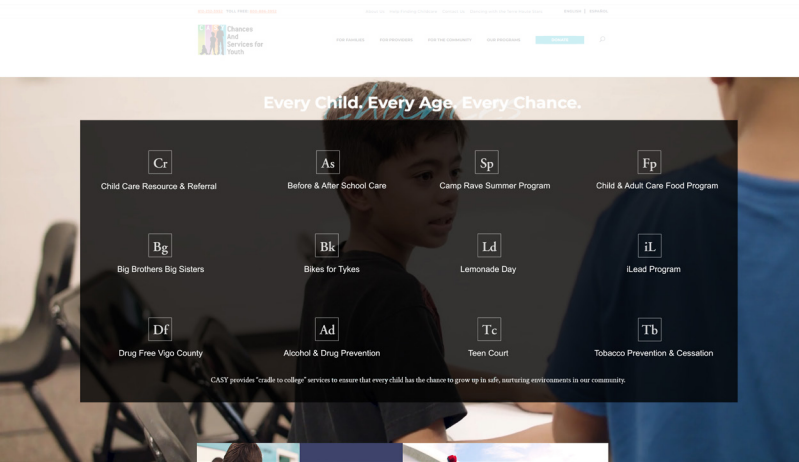
CASY provides “cradle to college” services to ensure that every child has the chance to grow up in safe, nurturing environments in our community.

This is useful in situations where we present all (or most) of our programs all at once. Visually, this helps them look coherent and complement one another.

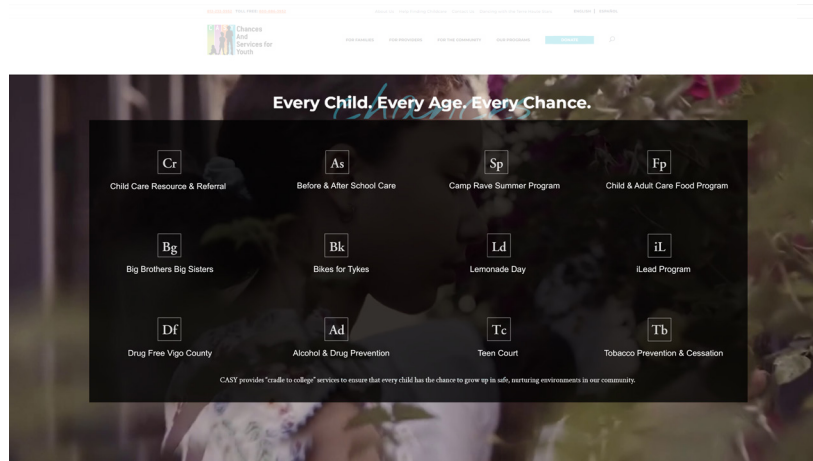
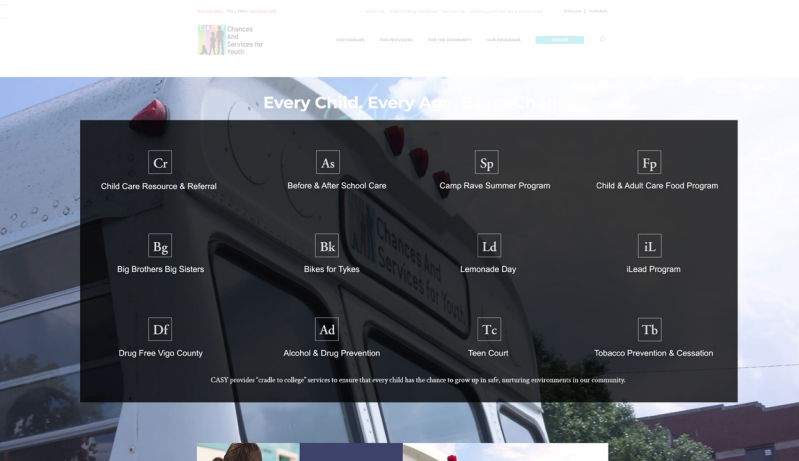

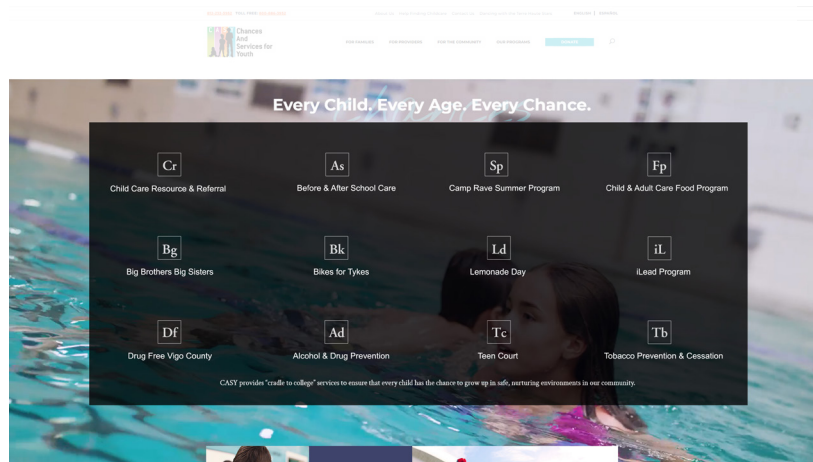
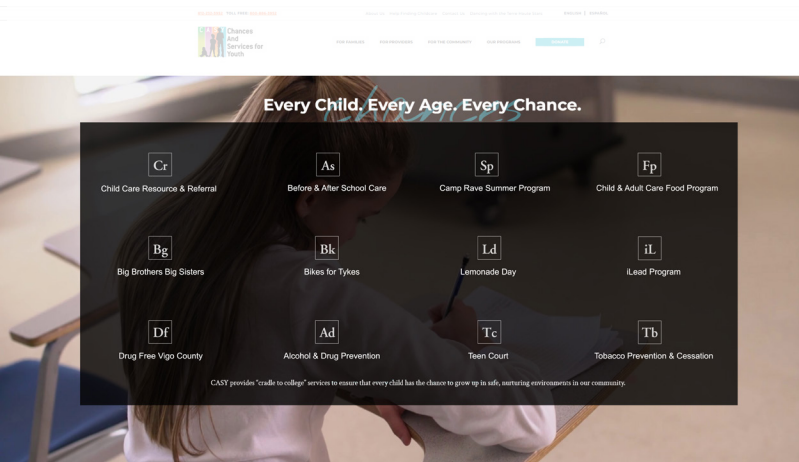
Since the inspiration example (VCSD) works well by stacking the icons onto a giant photo, the idea was stacking CASY's icons above our updated video.



To see how this looks in action, we can setup a private page as a test. That way we can see the video playing, and see the icons stacked on top.

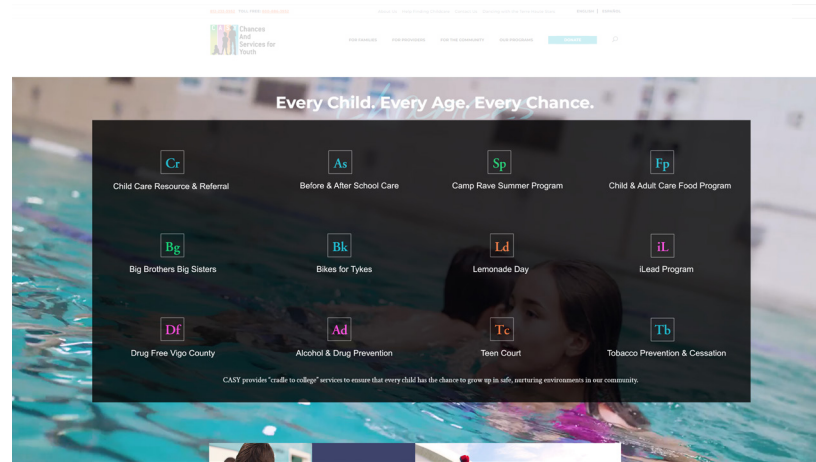
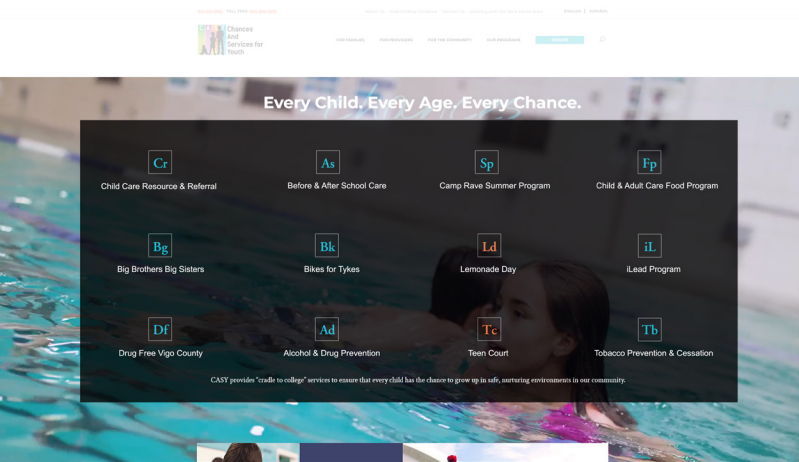


It also lets us use our video in a better way. Instead of taking up a giant portion of the homepage, the video now serves as the backdrop for our programs.

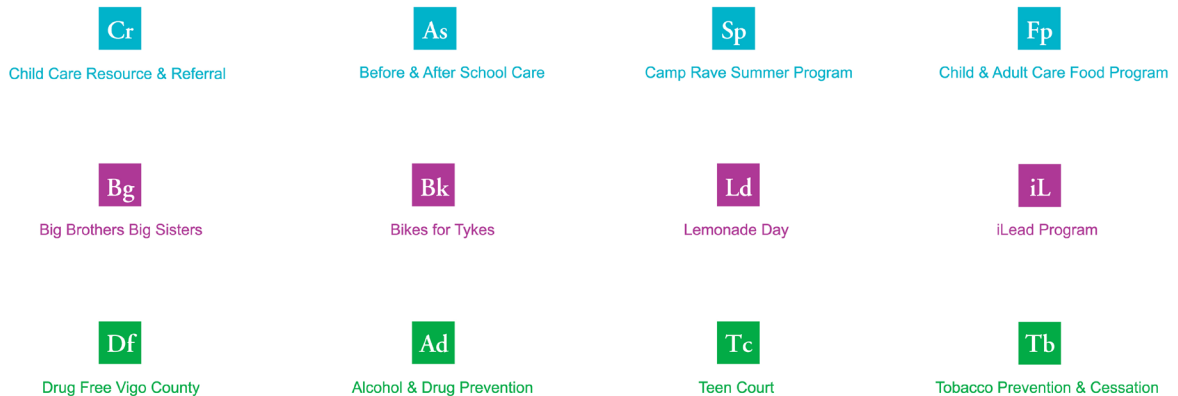
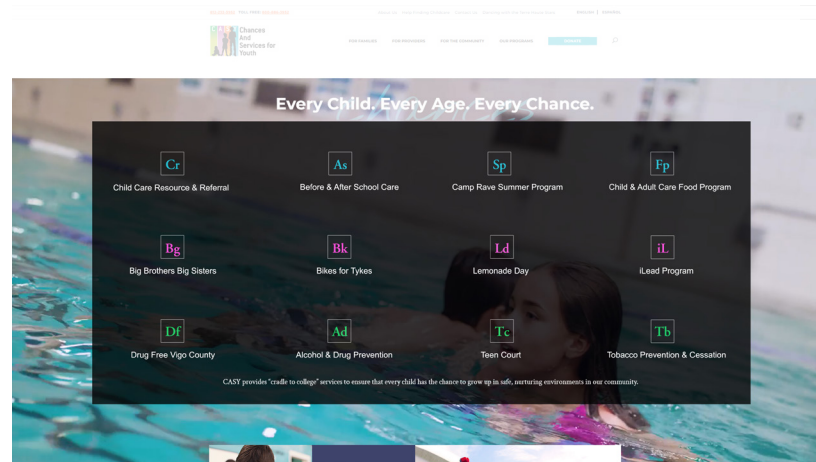
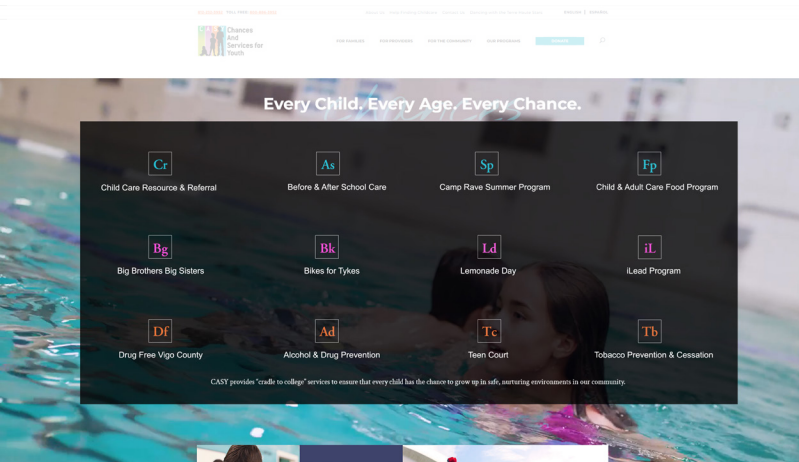


VISUAL LANGUAGE

Colors can be mixed and matched, drawing from the color palette of the CASY logo. The advantage is we aren't relying on a single icon to be emblematic of an entire program.

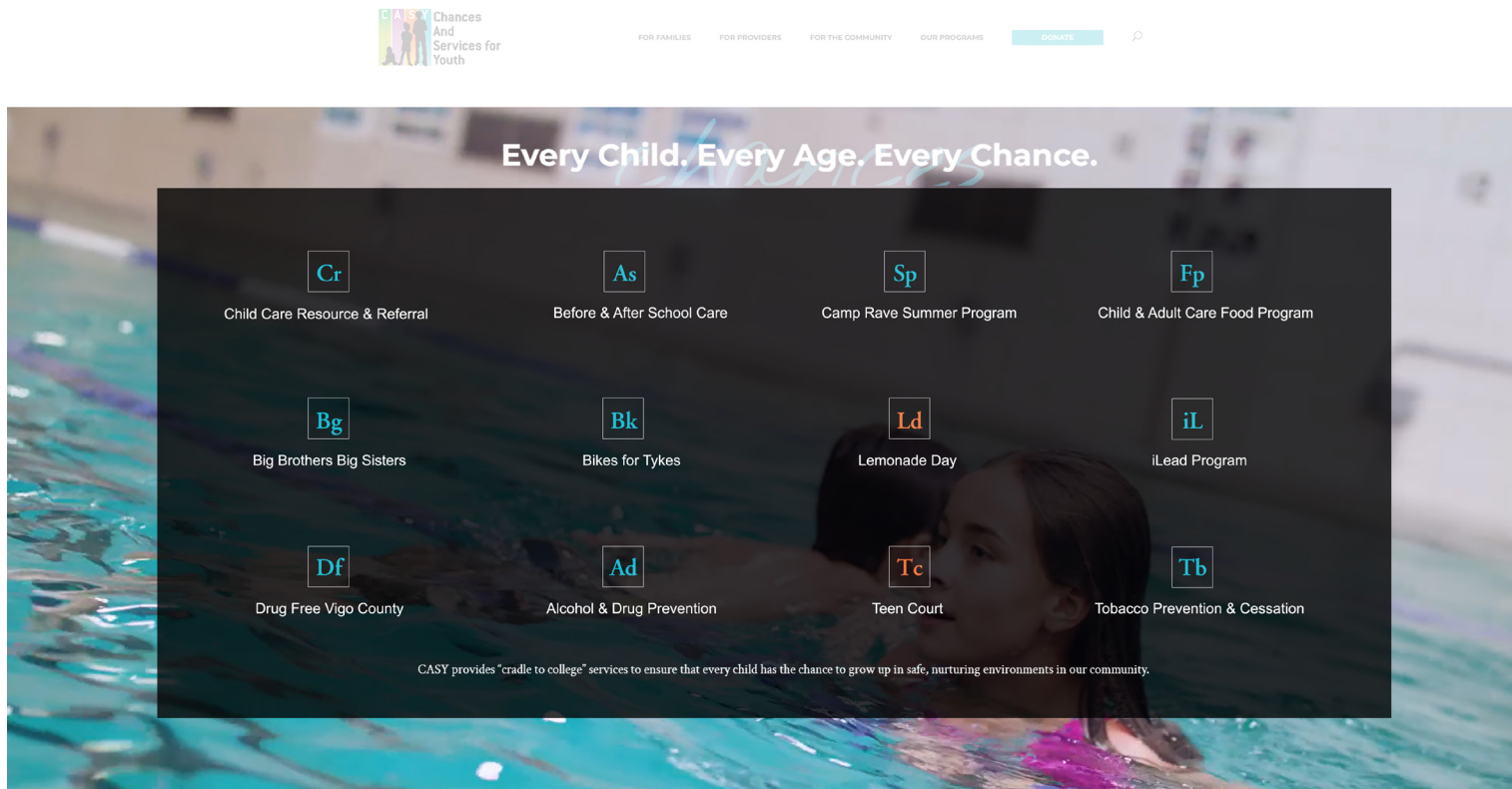


We can also alternate colors by row, to help "group" them visually.

We might also make the new Program Icons slightly smaller.
This helps place more emphasis on the text, and gives us some more room for other text.



The color might change when someone places their mouse or their finger on top of an icon. We could make the icon white, or even make it switch to a solid color.
